This workshop will introduce the role and functions of US Environmental Protection Agency, case studies of actual emergency responses to events which happened such as Hurricane Katrina, Anthrax, and train derailment resulting in a major chlorine leak, and much more. The objective of the workshop is learn and gain an understanding and insight of actual emergency response events that took place from those professionals who actually were involved in the preparation, coordination, and remediation of these high profile state of emergencies. The workshop will focus on occupational health and safety, industrial hygiene, public and environmental health issues faced during these catastrophic events and how they were dealt with. Guest speakers will be from the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry and US Environmental Protection Agency.
