TECHNICAL SESSION ON SAMPLING STRATEGIES

April 28, 1992

Description

This one day program will discuss effective workplace sampling strategies. The workshop will encompass the elements of hazard recognition, sample planning, the major components of an inhouse occupational hygiene program and the elements of a validated sampling system.

Objectives

To familiarize participants with the identification of workplace contaminants, the development of workplace sampling programs and the application of these programs in ongoing plant operations. These elements will be reviewed with the aim of producing validated results to substantiate decisions and provide historical data.

To provide a forum through which contacts can be established and information can be exchanged.

Who Should Attend:

The seminar is intended to benefit any individual who has responsibility for sampling programs in any workplace. This would include managers, health and safety professionals, occupational health nurses, consultants, occupational/industrial hygienists and health and safety committee members.
