The Atlantic Provinces Section of the AIHA is pleased to announce its upcoming Spring 2006 Workshop, OHSAS 18001 and Making a Business Case for OHS. This workshop will introduce 18001 standard, requirements of main elements, best practices and observed pitfalls from registration audits. A presentation/comparison to ANSI Z10 and CSA Z1000 and a workshop - Audit Scenario. The objective of the workshop is to go through a sample scenario to form an audit finding, explain how the internal/registration auditor might approach the scenario, the 18001 standard requirements, any non-conformance on the face of the evidence presented, and how auditor might writeup considering a process-based audit. The afternoon session will introduce participants to the scale of injury in Nova Scotia and provide an overview of the programs that the Workers' Compensation Board is introducing to act as a catalyst for change. It will also provide an overview of the Preventing Workplace Injuries program and resource family which is available as a resource. As well, A representative from Deloitte's Environment, Health, Safety & Sustainability Practice will present on emerging issues that affect OHS while offering a business focused approach.
