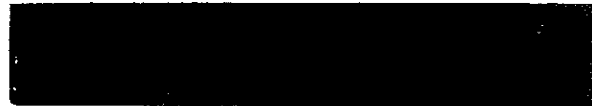

This seminar will provide an overview of indoor air quality from the perspectives of both the building occupants and managers. The presentations and discussions will deal with identifying and characterizing IAQ complaints. As well, the seminar will deal with HVAC systems, air chemistry and microorganisms.

Seminar Leaders:

Shelley Gray:

Ms. Gray studied occupational hygiene at McGill University after graduating from TUNS with a degree in chemical engineering. She has worked as an Occupational Hygienist for the Province of Nova Scotia for the past 7 years. Her interest in IAQ began during her studies at McGill when she prepared a thesis on the subject. She is currently the N. S. representative on the Federal/Provincial Working Group on IAQ.

Tedd Nathanson:

Mr. Nathanson is a graduate of Concordia University in mechanical engineering and is employed by Public Works Canada as a Senior Engineer, IAQ. He is responsible for developing new techniques for IAQ investigations, IAQ technology transfer advising Public Works on IAQ issues. Mr. Nathanson was appointed secretary of the Federal/Provincial Working Group on IAQ, whose mandate is to develop a national strategy for IAQ.

David Miller:

Dr. Miller was educated at UNB and Portsmouth Polytechnic (England). He completed his PhD in mycology at UNB in 1981. He was a N.A.T.O. Science Fellow at Portsmouth Polytechnic prior to his present position with Agriculture Canada. His work on fungi in indoor air has arisen from the need of several federal agencies to resolve IAQ complaints. This work has resulted in a model for fungal problems in Canadian buildings. Dr. Miller has produced a protocol for the elimination of fungal contamination in buildings.
