The Atlantic Provinces Section of the AIHA is pleased to announce its upcoming Spring 2005 Workshop, **Dust Sampling Methodology and Issues in Occupational Psychology**.

This workshop will initially bring all participants (regardless of background) up to speed in the fundamental concepts, principles and applications of dust sampling methodologies. A technical representative will give examples of potential sampling equipment and their application. A University Professor will discuss wood dust and size selective sampling considerations. The afternoon will consist of an occupational psychologist reviewing psychological issues in occupational health and safety. Transactional analysis theory of communication will be discussed, along with consideration of training issues, literacy, and compliance. The participants will be put into work groups to further explore these issues.

The Atlantic Provinces Section of the American Industrial Hygiene Association has invited Dr. Andrea Sass-Kortsak, University Professor, University of Toronto to speak to the dust issues. Dr. Martin McNeil is an Occupational Psychologist who will be addressing the psychology issues for the workshop.

Martin McNeil, MA is a psychologist with many years of experience in the industrial arena. Of particular interest to Mr. McNeil is the importance of training, participative management, EAP and teambuilding in the workplace. He has provided psychological expertise to several large industries

including police, airlines, Syncrude, Suncor, trucking companies, WCB and Canada Post.
